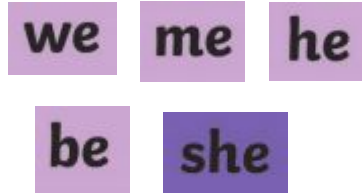

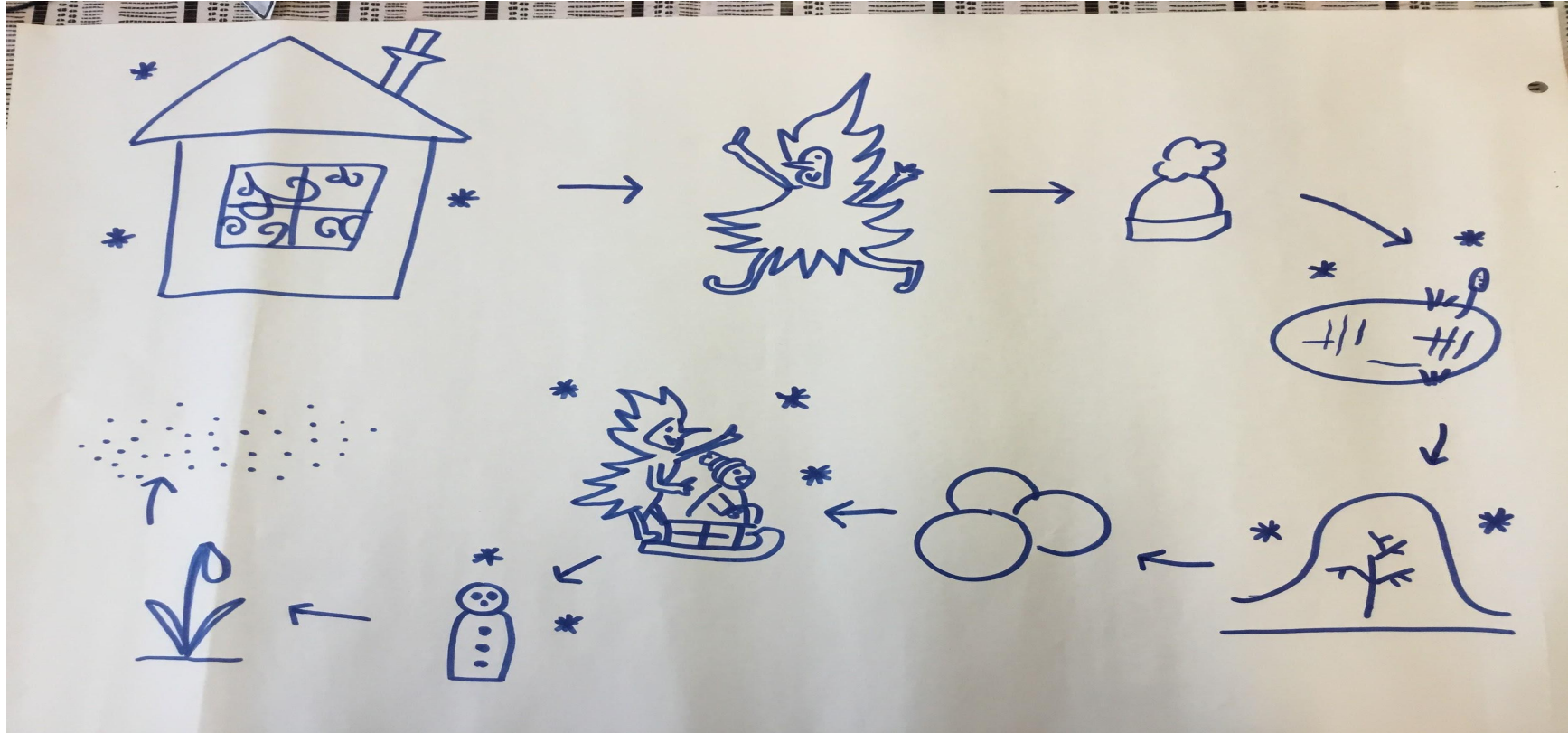

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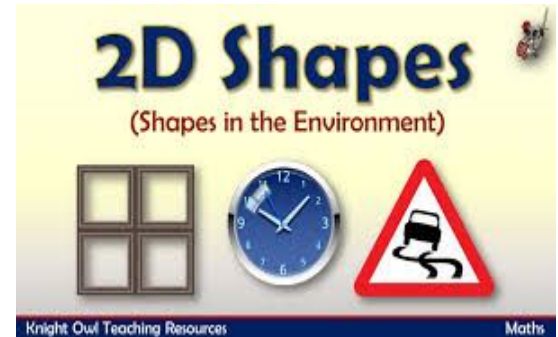
Nursery Maths

Using and manipulating playdough is great for developing your child's fine motor skills and strengthening the muscles in their hands and fingers.

Once you have made your playdough enjoy using with this video. We will be using the dough for other activities this week so to keep it fresh, pop it into a plastic bag or tub and store it in the fridge!

Expressive Art and Design

Let's get messy! Today, we would like you to make your own playdough. You can choose the colour you would like your playdough to be and you can use your playdough to make anything you like!

Recipe:

1 cup of flour

¼ cup of salt

1 teaspoon of vegetable oil

1 teaspoon of cream of tartar (if available)

Food Colouring of choice

Method:

- Mix the flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil in a large mixing bowl
- Add food colouring TO the boiling water then into the dry ingredients
- Stir continuously until it becomes a sticky, combined dough
- Allow it to cool down then take it out of the bowl and knead it vigorously for a couple of minutes until all of the stickiness has gone.
- If it remains a little sticky then add a touch more flour until just right
